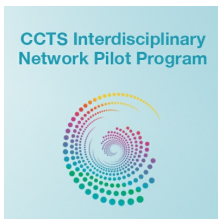

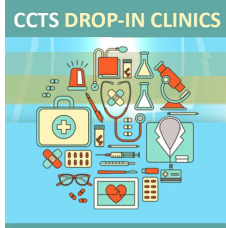
CCTS Radiology Pilot Research Initiative

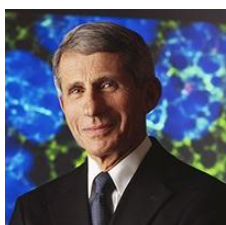
