This event is an orientation to the new policy requiring a Data Management and Sharing Plan for most NIH grants submitted on or after Jan 25, 2023. Dr. Hertz will focus on what researchers need to know to write their own data management plans. Attendees will learn:

- What the policy states, which funding mechanisms fall under the new policy, and how the changes will affect grant submissions.
- Where to access resources, templates, and sample data management plans.
