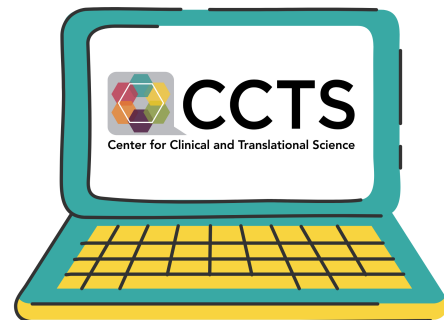
## Get to Know the 2021 CCTS Trainees & Scholars

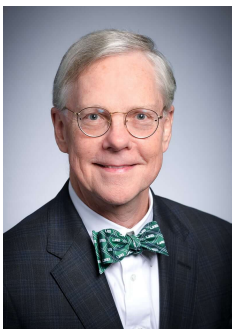
