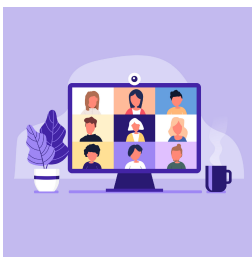
## Don't Miss "Budgeting for NIH Proposals: Tips and Best Practices" this Friday

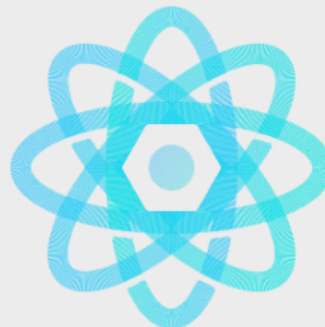
